# Sun, Sea, Sand, and Scholarship 51<sup>st</sup> Annual Meeting ~ Sheraton Kauai, Poipu ~ February 8–11, 2012

Aloha! It's time again to brush off our elementary Hawaiian: WRSA is meeting for the 9<sup>th</sup> time in Hawaii in February 2012. For this, WRSA's 51<sup>st</sup> annual meeting, we have just the location to get the next 50 years of association history and memory making started on the right track: the Sheraton Kauai Resort in Poipu, Hawaii. Many members will recall this hotel from WRSA's 39<sup>th</sup> Annual Meeting, with its location right on the ocean, as well at its attractive meeting space, which is in the final throes of renovation just in time for our arrival.

Plan now to be part of what is sure to be a productive and enjoyable conference. As always, the paper submission deadline is <u>October 15</u>. The meeting will get underway on the afternoon of Wednesday, February 8 with an opening session and welcoming reception. Concurrent paper sessions will run all day Thursday, Friday, and Saturday, February 9<sup>th</sup>-11<sup>th</sup>.

Along with a truly excellent location, the WRSA meeting will feature, as usual, its signature 45-minute paper slots, which include time for assigned discussant remarks and open discussion. WRSA meetings are a great venue for feedback on research!

And speaking of location, Kauai holds out the lure of not only a warm, sunny destination in the dead of winter, but also world-class beaches, stunning natural wonders like Waimea Canyon, and picturesque historic villages like Hanapepe. This northernmost of the Hawaiian Islands is often referred to as the "Garden Isle," for its lush tropical rainforests, soaring green mountains, and verdant valleys. Those who can spare the time may want to take a few extra days to soak up the Hawaiian atmosphere.

Do keep in mind that winter in Hawaii is popular. Be sure to make your flight and hotel arrangements early!

**Booking a Room at the Sheraton...**We have negotiated an excellent room rate for winter in Hawaii: Garden View rooms are available at \$175 per night, plus tax, single or double occupancy. Deluxe Oceanfront rooms are also available, at \$225 per night, plus tax. These rates are valid Saturday, February 4 through the night of Sunday, February 12 and will hold for the three nights before and after these dates, subject to availability at the time of reservation. As always, some nights of our room block may fill, so please reserve early!

*Travel Information...* While it's true that Kauai, Hawaii is a little island in the middle of the Pacific Ocean, its airport is well served by local Hawaiian airlines, as well as all the major U.S. carriers. In planning your travel to the meeting, you will want to book a flight to Lihue Airport. From the airport, the trip to the Sheraton will take about 30 minutes. To take advantage of the many sightseeing opportunities on Kauai, you may want to consider renting a car, although taxi and limousine service are also available from the airport to the hotel. Submitting a Paper...Papers should be submitted by October 15. Remember that WRSA does not accept papers based on abstracts. However, draft papers will be considered, with the understanding that a complete version will arrive at WRSA headquarters by December 31. All papers are screened by the Program Committee before formal invitations are issued. Important to remember: Only one paper may be presented per registrant.

For papers with multiple authors, *please indicate which authors plan to attend the meeting* and include email addresses for all anticipated participants. Manuscripts should be emailed to Rachel Franklin (wrsa@brown.edu) as an attachment in either pdf or Word format.

The Preliminary Program will be posted by late December, at which time any papers in "draft" format will need to be updated with final versions.

*Meeting Preregistration...*Meeting registration is handled via the North American Regional Science Council's e-store, where payment can be made by major credit card or personal check (payable in U.S. dollars). The WRSA website has instructions and a link to the NARSC website.

All meeting attendees are required to pay registration fees and will, through their meeting participation, become 2012 members of WRSA.

In Memory of Alex Vias, Winner of the 12<sup>th</sup> Annual Tiebout Prize

Alex Vias, Associate Professor of Geography

at the University of Connecticut, died of a heart attack on April 25, 2011. He was 51.

Alex was a widely respected population and economic geographer best known for his research on micropolitan areas, population change, economicdemographic linkages, and the settlement geography of rural America. He was very active in organizing and participating in rural geography sessions at AAG and regional science meetings. He also worked collaboratively with federal researchers from, e.g., the USDA Economic Research Service, and the Census Bureau.

Alex completed his M.A. and PhD at the University of Arizona in Tucson. His doctoral committee was comprised of three longtime WRSA members: Gordon Mulligan (Chair), David Plane, and Art Silvers. In 1998, Alex was awarded the 12<sup>th</sup> Annual Tiebout Prize for his paper, "An Analysis of Population and Employment Growth in the Rocky Mountain West, 1970–95."

From 1998–2002 Alex served as an Assistant Professor at the University of Northern Colorado. After subsequently moving to Storrs, he was tenured and promoted to Associate Professor in 2005. In recent years he was the Director of UConn's Urban and Community Studies Program.
